Lori Peek and colleagues were awarded **\$225,000** from the **Andrew W. Mellon Foundation** for their project ***Deep Horizons: Making Visible and Unseen Spectrum of Ecological Casualties & Prospects***, which expands conversation around environmental futures with a graduate seminar, public exhibitions, and national and international speakers. This was the first year that CU Boulder was invited to apply for a prestigious [Mellon Sawyer Seminar Series](#) grant. The other CU Boulder faculty members involved with the project are Erin Espelie (Cinema Studies and Critical Media Practices) Brianne Cohen (Art and Art History), and Andrew Cowell (Linguistics).
