- Explore young people's access to and experiences with medication abortion
- Describe the role of structural factors,
  i.e., PI requirements, in medication
  abortion access and use



### Youth Abortion Study

- Qualitative interviews
- Young people who had or considered abortion between 13-17 years old & 18-22 years old
- 25-30 interviews in 4 states








No parental involvement law


•State Medicaid covers abortion care





Parental notification required

•State Medicaid does\_not cover abortion care






Parental notification required

(until 7/2022)

•State Medicaid covers abortion care



# JANE'S DUE PROCESS teens. reproductive rights. texas

Parental consent required

•State Medicaid does *not* cover abortion care

•No access to abortion after 6 weeks (since 9/2021)

Stratified random sample of APCs in Colorado (2018–19)

Reproductive health knowledge, attitudes, and practices

N=513 (response rate 21%)

- 12% of APCs aware they can legally provide abortion
- 45% are interested or possibly interested in medication abortion
- 31% are interested or possibly interested in aspiration abortion

- 48% of APCs are willing & able to provide pregnancy options counseling
- Lack of knowledge main reason for unwillingness & inability to counsel
- 31% refer to crisis pregnancy centers
