


#### Motivation

  - rural health patterns


#### 1) Challenges of Scale: Spatial Mismatch

Place-county mismatch: Poverty (1980-2010)



Place-county mismatch: Persistent poverty counties and places




# 1) Challenges of Scale: Remoteness Index

Poverty rate by population trajectory and county metro adjacency



T1. High persistent poverty, young


T2. Prosperous and ageing




Local concentration of trajectory




# 3) Rural Health Patterns: Elderly & Extreme Events

Federally declared disasters in 2016 (FEMA)




Per-capita property loss in 2016 (SHELDUS)


